
### *Greetings from the president.*

## Second Annual Exhibition for Collaboration Between the Arkansas Pastel Society and the Ozark Pastel Society

The second annual collaboration between the **Ozark Pastel Society (OPS)** and the **Arkansas Pastel Society (APS)** to exhibit members' works was held at John Brown University Fine Arts Gallery in Siloam Springs from April 4 through April 26, 2024.

Seventy paintings were hung representing the work of 37 artists from the OPS/APS pastel organizations. "These paintings looked beautiful in the JBU Visual Arts Department Fine Arts Gallery," stated exhibit organizer Caprise Cooper.

During the opening reception on Thursday, April 11, four artists demonstrated during the opening reception by painting a portrait, a landscape, a still life and a pet portrait. A hands-on area allowed attendees the opportunity to experience using the pastel medium.

APS and OPS host this exhibit in alternate years. The 2025 exhibit will be hosted by APS.

## Dennis McCann Presented Program at April APS Meeting

**A**PS member Dennis McCann presented the program at the April APS meeting. Dennis's demonstration concentrated on draped garments.

When Dennis sees things draped, such as a shirt or other clothing, he likes to study the cast shadows by placing the cloth across something like a lawn chair to allow it to drape. He sets the scene up that he wants to paint and takes a photograph and works from the photo. He does not work on an easel but attaches his paper to the wall that has been painted with an orange peel textured paint because he likes the texture he gets on the paper when pastel is applied. By working on the wall he feels he can really push the pastel into the paper.

His paper of choice is 140 pound cold press paper with a deckled edge which he buys in 30" x 34" sheets from

Blick. Rembrandts are his preferred pastel with a few Sennelier, Terry Ludwig and Jack Richardson pastels thrown in the mix. He also uses a charcoal pencil for

things such as the spokes of a bicycle. He uses a ruler when placing two values together and then uses his thumb and drags straight down between the values. He establishes his darks and lights first as reference points. If an area is too dark he takes a white eraser and removes the dark pastel and he cleans his edges with a kneaded eraser.

Dennis does his own framing. He attaches the painting to foam core board with double sided velcro. He builds his frame by ripping 1 x 4 lumber in half. He always uses plexi, never glass.


Dennis holds both a Bachelors and a Masters degree in art. He attended college at Arkansas State University and the University of Arkansas at Little Rock. He has been a teacher and is a retired Captain with the Little Rock Fire Department.

Artists who influenced him were Norman Rockwell with his illustrative style that allowed the artist to tell a story, his college instructor, Al Allan and artist Edward Hopper, for their use of light and shadow.

Dennis will lead an APS mini workshop on September 14 of this year.





Hello APS Members -

We have been invited again to exhibit our work at the Thea Foundation Gallery for the month of July. If you are not familiar with the Thea Foundation and their work, please visit their website [theafoundation.org](http://theafoundation.org) for more information.

The exhibition runs Monday, July 1 - Thursday, July 25, 2024. Please plan to attend the reception on Friday, July 19 from 5:30 - 8:30 p.m. during the Argenta Art District's Art Walk.

## Show Details:

- Open to all APS members with dues in good standing.
- This is a non-juried show.
- We will have the public vote for "People's Choice" award.
- There is no fee for entry.
- Works can be "not for sale" (NFS).
- All sales will be made directly with the artist.
- Thea will not be collecting commissions for any paintings sold during the show.
- All paintings must hang throughout the duration of the show, even if sold.
- Thea will provide the title cards.

## Entry Requirements:

- Paintings must not have been exhibited in any previous Members Only show at Thea.
- Paintings must be a minimum of 80% pastel.
- Each member may submit up to two paintings.
- Each member will have at least one painting exhibited in the show, their second painting will be hung based on remaining space available in the gallery. Note: In years past we have been able to hang all paintings submitted.
- Entries must be suitably framed under glass or plexiglass and ready to hang with wire hangers.
- No sawtooth hangers.


- Entries are due by Saturday, June 1, 2024.

  - Drop off at Thea Foundation between 10:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Wednesday, June 26 and Thursday, June 27.

  - Enter through the front door on Main Street.
  - If the door is locked ring the doorbell and someone will buzz you in.

  - Pick Up of Work: Between 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. on Friday, July 26 at Thea Foundation.
- Shipping

  - Send using prepaid reusable crates with a PREPAID RETURN shipping label sent with the artwork.
  - Do not use foam peanuts for packing.
  - Insure for your own protection.
  - Artists should arrange for the shipping provider to do an indoor delivery.

  - Shipped Entries Returned: Paintings will be packaged and returned no later than Monday, July 29.
